The Rosy Yarrow of the garden border is a variety of the same plant, and one so rare in its beauty, though commonest of the common, that its flowers may be as fairly likened to jewelry as any other flowers that have been so honoured. The wild yarrow is usually white, but it is by no means uncommon to meet with many shades...
